January Full Moon





Today, most western countries have a solar calendar widely known as the Gregorian calendar with 365 days divided into 12 months of 28 to 31 days each. Many eastern countries still follow a lunar calendar and their new year, as well as many other festivities do not always fall on the same day of the year but around a particular full or new moon of a given month. Cultures that traditionally followed a lunar calendar or even communities such as agricultural communities often named the 13 moons of each year much as we name the 12 months of our year. Month means moon which is the proof that the idea of months came from the moon originally. Before the modern calendars were put into use, most calendars followed 13 months which followed the 28-day cycles of the moon. With 13 months of 28 days, the year was 364 days instead of 365 which means, after several years, the calendar was off track. Today we have longer months and 365 days, so each month has one full moon making 12 full moons per year. However, every two and a half years a blue moon occurs meaning we have 13 moons in one calendar year. Hence the saying, "Once in

a blue moon." This series of articles will talk about each moon, its significance, and the origin of its name for each month.

The January full moon is called the Wolf Moon because the howling of the wolves was louder and more frequent from January to February which was the period where wolves search for mates for the breeding season. Wolves howl on nights where the moon is not full as well but, being nocturnal animals, the nights of the full moon they may be more active because they have more light from the moon to hunt and find partners. Some cultures also refer to the January Moon as the ice moon because of it being one of the coldest months of the year or the moon after Yule being the first full moon after the Yule festivities. This new year 2023, the January full moon will be around January 7th. Take a look at your local farmer's almanac for the best viewing times in your area. Since the full moon takes place toward the beginning of the month of January, many of you may like to use the power of this full moon for manifestation spells you have prepared during Yule. Gather all your ingredients in advance as some may take time to prepare or find. I wish all of you an excellent 2023! May we combine our positive energies to have a major influence on the energy of mankind. Many beautiful things are happening around the world even though there are also terrible things. Try not to allow the horrors to drag you down and remain focused on the positive points. Remember to focus on love, joy, and health. Everything will turn out well in the end as long as we keep our faith in our divine selves.

Janus

Janus, in Roman religion, the animistic spirit of doorways (januae) and archways (jani). Janus and the nymph Camasene were the parents of Tiberinus, whose death in or by the river Albula caused it to be renamed Tiber.

The worship of Janus traditionally dated back to Romulus and a period even before the actual founding of the city of Rome. There were many jani (i.e., ceremonial gateways) in Rome; these were usually freestanding structures that were used for symbolically auspicious entrances or exits. Particular superstition was attached to the departure of a Roman army, for which there were lucky and unlucky ways to march through a janus. The most famous janus in Rome was the Janus Geminus, which was actually a shrine of Janus at the north side of the Forum. It was a simple rectangular bronze structure with double doors at each end. Traditionally, the doors of this shrine were left open in time of war and were kept closed when Rome was at peace. According to the Roman historian Livy, the gates were closed only twice in all the long period between Numa Pompilius (7th century BC) and Augustus (1st century BC).

Some scholars regard Janus as the god of all beginnings and believe that his association with doorways is derivative. He was invoked as the first of any gods in regular liturgies. The beginning of the day, month, and year, both calendrical and agricultural, were sacred to him. The month of January is named for him, and his festival took place on January 9, the Agonium. There were several important temples erected to Janus, and it is assumed that there was also an early cult on the Janiculum, which the ancients took to mean "the city of Janus."




Janus was represented by a double-faced head, and he was represented in art either with or without a beard. Occasionally he was depicted as four-faced—as the spirit of the four-way arch.

Gemstone Corner

CITRINE

The Citrine stone is a great one to have for bringing success and wellbeing to its owner. You must be careful when buying a Citrine though because they are quite rare in nature and many cheaper specimens are artificially made by heating other crystals to give them the same color and aspect as the Citrine. It may look identic but its energy resonance will not be the same so it may not work as you would like it to. Citrine is a form of quartz composed of iron and silicon dioxide. It comes in many shades of yellow to orange and is among the harder natural crystals on the Mohs scale. This stone should not be exposed to heat as it will change color.

Citrine crystals are among those that do not need to be cleaned and charged regularly as they absorb and eliminate negative energy. They protect the environment and purify those that are in contact with it. The stone acts upon the sacral and solar chakras to purify and recharge them. All negative energy is absorbed so the stone acts as a shield and protects the wearer. The ancient Greeks and Egyptians used the Citrine to protect against the "Evil Eye" and to bring good fortune.

As a healing stone, the Citrine aids digestion and any abdominal pains including menstrual cramps. Psychologically the stone helps with depression by bringing joy and self-confidence. Ancient Egyptians used Citrine against snake bites and jealousy. Citrine draws positive and creative energy so it will boost your concentration, memory, and creativity.

In Egyptian mythology the Citrine is said to have been used to calm and appease Sekhmet, the lion-headed goddess from her destructive anger that was known to spread disease. The crystal gave her peace and healing powers and she then transformed into the house cat goddess Bastet, protector of families, women, and homes.

To clean and recharge a Citrine, place it in a recipient full of water overnight then let it dry naturally. Recharge it in the moonlight or in indirect sunlight because direct sun will fade the color of the stone.

January 18 - Day of Danu



Danu is a mother goddess in the Celtic and Irish traditions. She is the goddess of fertility, creation, water, and the land.

A creator goddess connected to earth and water, a goddess of fertility, abundance, and prosperity.

Danu, also referred to as Anu, is often associated with water. She commands rivers and helps humans find wells or springs.

She corresponds to the Welsh Ancestor Goddess Don. In the modern neopagan tradition, Danu is seen as both a primordial and a triple goddess.

She is also associated with the great oak, Bile. It is said when he was a seedling Bile drank of her waters and became a great tree. He produced two acorns which became their children, Brighid and Dagda.

The Tuatha Dé Danann (the tribe of the Goddess Danu) is a pantheon of the Irish Gaelic people. Danu is the mother of gods and she was believed to have suckled the gods as children.

The Tuatha Dé Danann is an ancient culture that predates the Milesians (the ancestors of the modern Irish). Lore says that they were extremely wise and gifted in magic and so were cast from the heavens because of this.

Archaeological evidence shows that they arrived about 1000 BCE and were a highly-skilled group of people who made many cultural advancements.

Thorrablot



Thorrablot was a sacrificial midwinter festival offered to the gods in pagan Iceland of the past. It was abolished during the Christianization of Iceland but resurrected in the 19th century as a midwinter celebration that continues to be celebrated to this day. The timing for the festival coincides with the month of Thorri, according to the old Icelandic calendar, which begins on the first Friday after January 19th (the 13th week of winter).

Origins of the name "Thorri" are unclear but it is most likely derived from Norwegian king Thorri Snærsson, or Thor the God of Thunder in the old Nordic religion.

On this occasion, locals come together to eat, drink and be merry. Customary, the menu consists of unusual culinary delicacies, known as traditional Icelandic food. These will include rotten shark's meat (hákarl), boiled sheep's head, (svið) and congealed sheep's blood wrapped in a ram's stomach (blóðmör)! This is traditionally washed down with some Brennivin - also known as Black Death – a potent schnapps made from potato and caraway.

After the Thorrablot dinner traditional songs, games and storytelling are accompanied by dancing and in true Icelandic style continue until the early hours of the morning! If you fail to receive a personal invitation to a family feast, local restaurants will often add Thorrablot colour and taste to their menus.

Festival Recipes for Early February

Recipe for Imbolc, Northern Hemisphere

Imbolc Potato Soup found at https://www.zinzeudo.com

Ingredients

- 8-12 slices bacon
- 1 cup butter
- 1 cup flour
- 8 cups milk
- 4 large baked potatoes, peeled and cubed
- 4 green onions, chopped
- 1 1/4 cups shredded cheese
- 1 cup sour cream
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground black pepper



Directions:

- 1. Cook bacon over medium heat until browned. Drain, crumble, and set aside.
- 2. In a stock pot, melt the butter over medium heat. Whisk in flour until smooth. Gradually stir in milk, stirring constantly until thick. Stir in potatoes and onions. Bring to a slow rolling boil, stirring frequently.
- 3. Reduce heat, and simmer for 10 minutes. Mix in bacon, cheese, sour cream, salt, and pepper. Continue cooking, stirring frequently, until cheese is melted.
- 4. Top with more bacon, cheese and green onions.

Recipe for Lughnasadh, Southern Hemisphere

Ingredients:

- 6 slices streaky bacon
- 4 cups chicken stock, hot
- 1 green onions, sliced, whites and greens divided
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- ¾ cup arborio rice
- ½ cup plain Greek yogurt
- 1-½ cups frozen corn kernels
- Salt and pepper to taste



Directions:

Put a large pot over medium heat. Use scissors to slice up your bacon directly into the pot. Cook your bacon, stirring occasionally, until crispy, then remove the bacon pieces to a paper towel lined plate. You'll want about a tablespoon of bacon grease left in the pot, so if your bacon has given off a lot of grease, you may need to drain some off.

To your reserved bacon grease, add a tablespoon of olive oil. Add the white parts of your sliced green onion, and cook over medium low heat to soften for about a minute.


Add the rice and toss it in the fat to coat every grain. Let this cook for a few minutes to get toasty. When it starts to smell nutty, you're ready to start adding stock.

Add the stock about a ¼ cup at a time, stirring all the while, until the liquid is absorbed before adding another ¼ cup of stock. Keep adding stock until it's all absorbed. It will take about a half hour.

Once your rice has absorbed all the liquid, stir in the corn, and let it cook for a few minutes to heat up the corn.

Remove the pot from the heat and stir in the yogurt to combine. Give it a stir and taste before you add salt and pepper to taste.




