Enquire Within for Everything (Well Almost!)

Today's scheduled article was posted on Thursday by mistake and follows on from the article below. For your information the article posted last week is also posted again this week following in the correct order.

Merry Meet Everyone,

It is that time in Australia when we begin to check out our stocks of winter remedies and take note of those we used a lot of this year. Well, in South-East Queensland it is anyway. ☺ In the southern states of course Australia is still well within the grip of winter, but here in Queensland the birds are beginning to do ridiculously spring things, the bulbs are standing high waiting for the word to flower, the bees are dodging raindrops to get their pollinating done in a hurry.

Despite it still being cold in the more western regions and being told by the weather man that frosts can be expected on the ranges there is still a definite feeling of 'Spring is in the air', here on the south-east coast.

The bright clear sunny days we experience here in June and July are reflected in the water on the Bay, still and calm and reflecting clear pale blue skies.

Then August gets ready to bluster in with westerly winds turning the bay, grey and choppy with tiny white capped waves, and storms come down from the North and the waves grow larger and the tides get higher and we look at the birds and say "see, told you your alarm clock is out of whack!!!" lol

It is such a day here outside my window as I type and the birds are rather quiet tucked up in the Fig trees and the Poinsettia's and I write this article instead of doing the housework piling up around me.

But I wander, as is my want, where were we? Oh yes winter remedies.

Firstly what types of remedies do we stock up on for winter?

- Well there are the syrups for coughs and colds,
- Remedies for the Arthritis and Rheumatism sufferers,
- Fever remedies,
- Nose and Throat remedies,
- Circulation remedies,
- And of course the usual first aid requirements.

How do we make efficacious syrups for coughs and colds?

Syrups are easily made from herbs and spices, but you must keep in mind whether the herb is suitable to take as a syrup, it is better to use the soothing demulcent herbs as syrups and the more pungent or bitter herbs as teas or tinctures.

To make a syrup you will need:

1 ½ oz (or 40grams) of your chosen fresh herb(s) chopped

3 ¾ cups (or 900ml) of filtered water

1lb (or 450grams) Sugar or Honey.

Method

- Place the chopped herbs and water in a stainless steel or glass saucepan and bring to the boil
- Turn down the heat
- Cover with the saucepan lid (a tight fit is best)
- Simmer gently for 20 mins.
- Strain into a glass measuring jug making sure all the liquid is drain (press the herbs into the strainer with the back of a spoon to get as much moisture out as possible).
- Discard the boiled herbs (compost?)
- Return the liquid to the saucepan and continue to simmer very gently until reduced to about 1 cup (or 200ml). Do this very slowly to get a good decoction.
- Add the sugar or honey to your decoction and dissolve slowly stirring gently until it is completely dissolved and is of a syrupy consistency.
- Let the syrup bubble for a short while watching carefully - **do not overheat** - as this will produce toffee (unless it is a cough syrup; then you may wish to make some lozenges from the toffee) to clean sterilized bottles, label with name of syrup, date made and the recommended dose.

Doses of Syrups may vary according to the herbs used by a good rule of thumb is;

For Adults: 2-3 teaspoons 3-6 times per day

For Children: 1 teaspoon 3-6 times per day

A good simple recipe for a cough syrup I found years ago in a book by Christopher Hedley and Non Shaw is given below.

Called Timely Relief Syrup you will require the following Ingredients:

25grams (1oz) of Thyme

6 cloves of Garlic

15 grams (½ oz) powdered or grated whole Cinnamon

8 grams (1/4 oz) of Aniseed seeds

1 teaspoon of powdered Ginger

459 grams (1lb) Sugar or Honey

And the juice of ½ a small lemon

Use the method given above to make.

Dosage for this syrup is generally a tad less than the average with 3-4 doses per day for adults being sufficient and 3 doses for children.

Note the herbs used in this syrup:

Thyme (*Thymus vulgaris*)

An antiseptic and expectorant good for thick, infected mucous/phlegm for dry, difficult coughs

Garlic (*Allium sativum*)

Antimicrobial, antifungal, for infections and immune boosters

Cinnamon (*Cinnamomum cassia*)

An antibacterial, for chills and fevers promotes sweating.

Aniseed (*Pimpinella anisum*)

A relaxing expectorant, antiseptic and carminative that is good for irritating dry coughs and bronchial infections.

Ginger (*Zingiber officianalus*)

A warming herb, a circulatory stimulant, promotes sweating

Lemon

Builds the immune system via Vitamin C, promotes sweating and is expectorant.

You could also use;

Boneset

Catmint

Marshmallow

Hyssop

Wild cherry

Ground Ivy

Golden seal

Bayberry

Elecampane

White Horehound

Chamomile

Eucalyptus

All have the same healing qualities for Colds and Flu in that they either promote sweating (therefore helping to break fevers) and elimination, or they sooth and support the lung and throat tissues, or they reduce and dry up excess mucous or

Reduce inflammation, warm, build the immune system in all ease the miseries of colds and flu.

My time is up, and the rest is left for another article or 3.

May you enjoy what is left of your Summer in the Northern Hemisphere as we will enjoy the coming Spring here in the South.

In the last article we looked at using syrups as remedies for coughs and colds, in this we will look at teas and Tisanes, sometimes commonly known as water infusions.

What is tea?

Well, we would normally think of the Camellia shrub (*Camellia sinensis*) when we think of tea. The tip leaves of Camellia are dried and cured to make the ordinary tea we drink at breakfast, morning tea, lunch, afternoon tea, dinner and supper. When I say we I of course am referring to those millions of people in the world who drink tea, as opposed to coffee as their main hot drink of the day.

This type of tea comes in different flavoured varieties but generally falls into 3 categories - Black, Green and of course White tea.

Black tea is dried and fully cured, Green tea is dried but not cured and White tea is dried and cured only a little (known as Emperors' Tea).

Then there are the Herb teas.

We have been through the definition of herbal teas in earlier articles so I won't bore you with that detail again, suffice to say that these are teas made from fresh or dried herbs and generally taken for a specific reason.

Herbal teas for relief of the symptoms of colds and flu generally contain the same types of herbs that we would use to make a syrup or a tincture for the same condition.

Teas and Tisanes are the easiest to make of all herbal remedies, all you need is a teapot (generally one with an infuser), hot water and the herbs themselves.

Put a teaspoon of the chosen herb into the infuser place the infuser in the teapot and pour on boiling water, let steep (sit) for 3-5 mins, pour into a cup and drink.

There are other uses however for a herbal tea than simply drinking it. These teas can be used as;

- gargle preparations, for sore throats and mouths,
- as lotions and rinses for the skin and hair,
- to make douches, compresses and fomentations.

If there is a herb you can use for the condition chances are you can treat it internally and externally with a tea or tisane.

A tisane, by the way is a bunch of herbs dried or fresh (though I generally use whole dried herbs for these), that is used repeatedly to make a tea, drying out between uses.

To make a compress, I use the herbs I make the tea with, taking them out of the infuser and laying on a clean piece of unbleached cotton folding this into a parcel like pad and placing on the affected skin area as hot as can be accepted comfortably (**not too hot!!!** Just hot enough so as to cause the skin to sweat enough to absorb the herbal remedy).

For a fomentation, simply make the tea and soak the cloth in it, then place over the affected area, similarly, causing the skin to sweat and absorb the herb into the body. I find this method of treating sore muscles using Epsom salts very successful.

Another good example is a Mustard soak/bath for the feet.

- 2 teaspoons of Mustard powder in a foot bath with a couple of litres of hot water, **cooled to comfortably hot** and soak away. Relieves tired feet, hot feet, cold feet, and sore feet.
- All kinds of discomfort and tension (tight shoes, army boots lol etc) can benefit from a nice footbath with Mustard, add some Epsom salt for even more relief.

You can also make a chamomile and lavender tea for a hand bath add Epsom salts here too. Nothing works harder than our hands and feet and neither really get the appreciation they are due.

So we have a lot of teas in our Winter medicine chest.

In the last article I meant to add a particular syrup for coughs but due to my wandering I did forget.

I got this recipe out of the same book I got the Relief syrup recipe from, but have my own version of it.

The Base recipe for fresh Onion Syrup is;

Ingredients

1 large or 2 small onions

450grams (1lb) brown granulated sugar or honey.

Method

Peel and slice onion

Using a jam or preserves jar

Pack 5cm (2inches) of onion into the bottom of the jar

Cover with the same thickness of sugar or honey

Compressing each subsequent layer down as you go

Continue to alternate layers of onion and sugar/honey until jar is full.

Cover with lid.

Leave to stand overnight.

Strain and bottle the liquid.

Keep in refrigerator or a cool dark place.

Dosage : Adult - 2 teaspoons 3 times per day or up to every 2 hours if fighting off a cold.

Children - ½ -1 teaspoon 3-6 times daily.

My Version.

Honey is not cheap to buy but is the best for this remedy so I played around with the recipe a mite.

Chop 1 small onion

Place in a small jam jar

Add 1 tablespoon of honey

Stand overnight

Take as the above dosage.

If you feel a cold coming on add 1 chopped garlic clove (you can get odourless).

It is very good for not getting the cold and for keeping other people at bay as well during cold and flu season.. ☺

I give you these remedies not because I found them in a book and they looked good but because I have used them, they are good and that is what we are all about, finding good information and sharing it.

I must stop writing and start working so till next time.

Veterinary Notes G is for Giant

The Giant Breeds of dogs include St. Bernards, Great Danes; Irish Wolfhounds; Leonbergers; Scottish Deerhounds and other dogs of similar size. These dogs must be considered as a distinct group for their husbandry (care) requirements differ considerably from those of more normal sized dogs. These differences are a consequence of breeding which has enlarged them considerably beyond the normal size of the canine ancestor which is perhaps best viewed as a wolf.

Having a larger skeleton than a normal sized dog presents problems. Puppies and juvenile dogs should have limited exercise only, far below the average for more normal dogs. This means that the new owner will not be able to take their new puppy out for walks through the countryside. Even as an adult, these breeds, with the exception of the deerhound, need surprisingly little exercise, far less than, for example, a Labrador.

To prevent distortion of the soft bones, the puppy needs to be fed from a raised surface so that it does not have to bend down to the food. This surface must be raised as the puppy grows, and must be used in the adult dog as well. There are assorted feeding stands now available on the market. Diet too must meet the demands of a rapidly growing puppy and, again, there are commercial diets available specifically for the giant breeds. Extra calcium is often recommended.

Not surprisingly, the giant size has effects on health. Most of these breeds, with the exception of the deer hound, have a very short lifespan of around 8 years. The deerhound differs from the other giants in that it has a relatively slim frame on very long legs, and this may account for the variance. In addition, the long bones of the limbs have a tendency to develop an aggressive bone cancer, osteosarcoma, which metastasises (spreads) rapidly through the body. The first sign of this tumour is often a spontaneous fracture of a limb. If diagnosed early enough, treatment invariably requires amputation, something that is impractical in a giant breed as the dog would have enormous difficulty supporting its large frame on just three legs.

Lastly, think very carefully before selecting one of these breeds. Consider the extra care they require, the short life, and the amount of room they take up when lying stretched out across the living room carpet. Some, like the St. Bernard, tend to drool excessively with strings of mucus flying through the air when they shake their heads. I remember one lady whose sofa was always wet because of this drool. Other points to think about are bathing and strength. How do you plan to bath the dog because there will be times when it gets very dirty, and the thick coats on these dogs then to “pong” particularly when damp after a walk in the rain? Do you have the physical strength to control one of these dogs? Remember that with a body weight of around 16 stones, once they go into “turbo” mode they can be very difficult to stop.

They can be beautiful and loving dogs but they are not right for many homes, and to keep them in the wrong situation does justice to neither dog nor owner.
