Ostara **Celebrated in the Northern Hemisphere**

As Spring reaches its midpoint, night and day stand in perfect balance, with light on the increase. The young Sun God now celebrates a hierogamy (sacred marriage) with the young Maiden Goddess, who conceives. In nine months, she will again become the Great Mother. It is a time of great fertility, new growth, and newborn animals.

The next full moon (a time of increased births) is called the Ostara and is sacred to Eostre the Saxon Lunar Goddess of fertility (from whence we get the word estrogen, whose two symbols were the egg and the rabbit).

The Christian religion adopted these emblems for Easter which is celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the vernal equinox. The theme of the conception of the Goddess was adapted as the Feast of the Annunciation, occurring on the alternative fixed calendar date of March 25 Old Lady Day, the earlier date of the equinox. Lady Day may also refer to other goddesses (such as Venus and Aphrodite), many of whom have festivals celebrated at this time.

Traditional Foods:

Leafy green vegetables, Dairy foods, Nuts such as Pumpkin, Sunflower and Pine. Flower Dishes and Sprouts.

Herbs and Flowers:

Daffodil, Jonquils, Woodruff, Violet, Gorse, Olive, Peony, Iris, Narcissus and all spring flowers.

Incense:

Jasmine, Rose, Strawberry, Floral of any type.

Sacred Gemstone:

Jasper

Special Activities:

Planting seeds or starting a Magickal Herb Garden. Taking a long walk in nature with no intent other than reflecting on the Magick of nature and our Great Mother and her bounty.

Egg Dyeing

- Eggs
- Food Dye
- Cake Pan
- Tablespoon or Tongs or Coat Hanger

There are two ways of coloring eggs.

1 step dyeing

If you are dyeing large batches of eggs and you want them to be solid color then I would recommend adding the color of your choice in food dye to water you are going to use to hard boil the eggs. I like the colors to be bold so I add a bit more food coloring than is needed and I let the eggs sit in the water until they are cool to the touch.

Then I take them out and let them dry, normally in a cake pan.

Once they are dry I let my 3 year-old decorate the eggs with stickers and markers. I found this to be a less messy alternative and is one that I highly recommend for younger kids.

If your kids want to hand decorate eggs then all you need is a piece of short wire that has a loop on the end big enough to hold an egg steady yet small enough that the egg does not slip through. An inexpensive metal coat hanger will work. If you do not wish to destroy a coat hanger you can use a tablespoon or a set of tongs.

First boil the eggs for about 10 minutes in a pot of water.

While the eggs are boiling set up small cups of water. The cups need to be big enough to completely submerge one egg with a little room to spare.

Next add a few drops of food coloring to the cups of water. You can mix the basic colors to achieve any number of colors. The sky is the limit on making your own shades of colors.

Allow the eggs to dry.

Pick an egg and put it into one of your cups with dyed water. Allow to sit for 30 second to 1 minute before removing. The longer you leave the egg in, the bolder the colors will be.

Dish Towel Bunny

Materials:

- 1 dish towel
- 2 washcloths
- Ribbon

What you do

Lay the dishtowel on the table with the wrong side up. Fold in thirds lengthwise. Fold in thirds again. Set aside.

Take one of the washcloths and starting at one corner roll to the middle. Roll the opposite corner to the middle to meet it This will be the ears.

Fold the top part of the dishtowel down about 1/3 of the way. Take the washcloth "ears" and lay them inside the fold--Grab the ears by the points and pull up tightly

Tie with a piece of ribbon as close to the dishtowel as you can (tie a bow with the ribbon)

Tie another bow under the bulge you made with the ears. This makes the head.

Starting at the edge roll up the other washcloth This will be the arms.

Slide the "arms" in between the back and front of the dishtowel up to the "neck". Tie a bow under the arms. This makes the waist.

Bring the "hands" to the front and tie at the "wrists" with another bow

You should have a little lady bunny ready to hold some wooden spoons, an Easter basket, flowers, etc.

Recipes

Spinach (or Broccoli) Quiche

1 9-in pie crust, unbaked

3 eggs, beaten

8 oz pkg of Swiss cheese slices

1/2 tsp salt

2 tbsp flour

dash pepper

1 c milk

dash nutmeg

1 small onion, sliced and sauted lightly

10 oz pkg frozen spinach (chopped) or broccoli, cooked and drained

Cut cheese in strips. Toss with flour. In pie crust, alternate layers of onion, spinach (or broccoli) and cheese, ending with cheese layer. Mix milk, eggs, and spices. Pour into crust.

Bake at 350 degrees for one hour or until toothpick comes out clean.

Spring Sabbat Incense

3 parts Frankincense

2 parts Sandalwood

1 part Benzoin

1 part Cinnamon

a few drops Patchouli oil

Burn during spring and summer Sabbat rituals

Ostara Incense

2 Parts Frankincense

1 Part Benzoin

1 Part Dragon's Blood

1/2 Part Nutmeg

1/2 part Violet flowers (or few drops violet oil)

1/2 Part Orange peel

1/2 Part Rose petals

Burn during Ostara rituals.

Ostara Oil

2 parts frankincense

1 part benzoil

1 part dragon's blood

½ part nutmeg

½ part violet

½ part orange

½ part rose

Mabon Incense

- 2 Parts Frankincense
- 1 Part Sandalwood
- 1 Part Cypress
- 1 Part Juniper
- 1 Part Pine
- 1/2 Part Oakmoss (or few drops of Oakmoss Bouquet)
- 1 Pinch Pulverized oak leaf

Burn during Mabon rituals.

Stuffed Acorn Squash

- 2 acorn squash, washed and cut in halves
 - 1/2 stick of butter
 - 1/2 cup of crushed Ritz crackers
 - 1/4 cup chopped walnuts
 - 1/4 cup brown sugar
2. Wash and cut acorn squash in half from stem to bottom
 3. Scoop out the seeds and rub the inside and cut parts with butter
 4. Put the acorn squash on a cookie sheet
 5. Melt the butter, and mix in the walnuts, brown sugar, and crackers

Place in the holes of the squash and bake at 350 degrees for 30 - 40 minutes or until done

Wild Rice with Apples and Walnuts

- 1 cup wild rice
- 2 cups water
- 1 Tablespoon vegetable oil

Cook rice and oil in water for 50 minutes.

- 1 cup walnuts
- 1 rib of celery, chopped
- 4 chopped scallions
- 1 cup raisins
- 1 red apple, peeled and chopped, set aside in lemon water
- 2 teaspoons grated lemon rind

Combine nuts, celery, onions, raisins, drained apple and lemon rind and set aside.

- 3 T. lemon juice
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1/2 t. salt
- 1/3 cup olive oil
- pepper, to taste

Whisk together juice, salt and pepper, garlic and oil and add to cooked rice.

Add fruit mixture to the rice (to which has been added oil, spices and juice) and mix well. May be served cold or heated.
