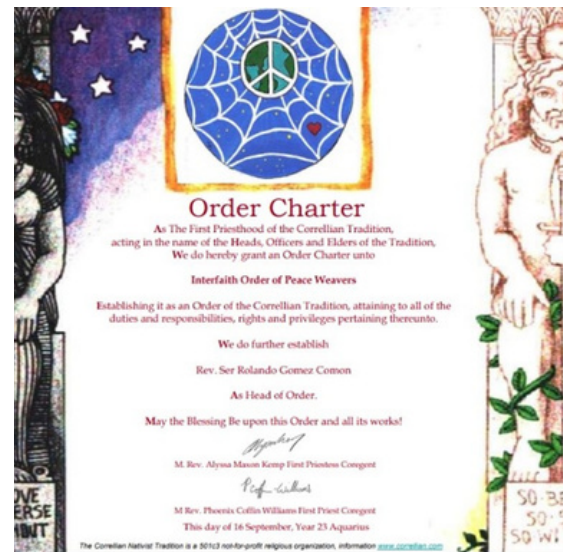

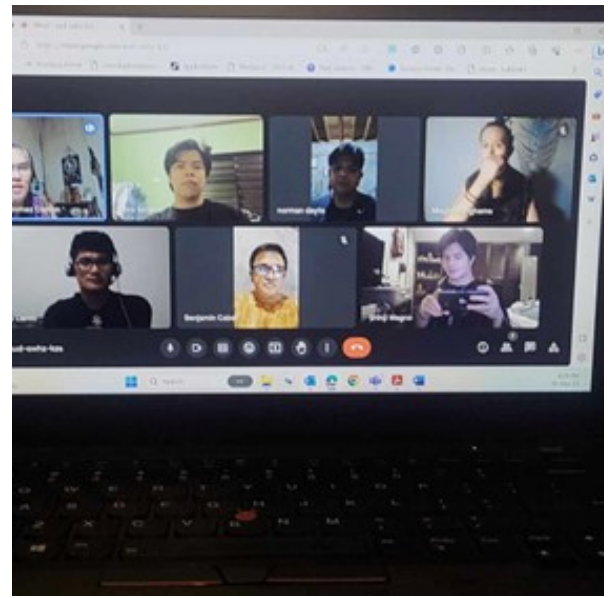
## Peace Weaving with Apu. cont.

Holding a Fire Ceremony/Ritual is as simple or as complex as you make it. It can be a as simple as throwing herbs into a fireplace or bonfire.

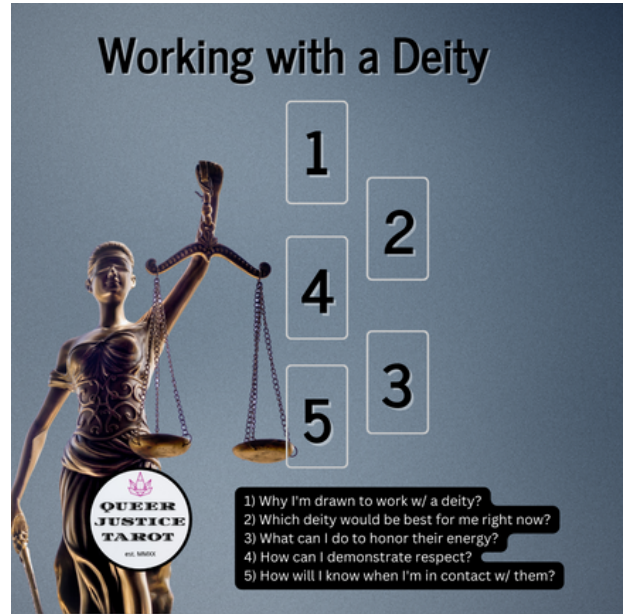

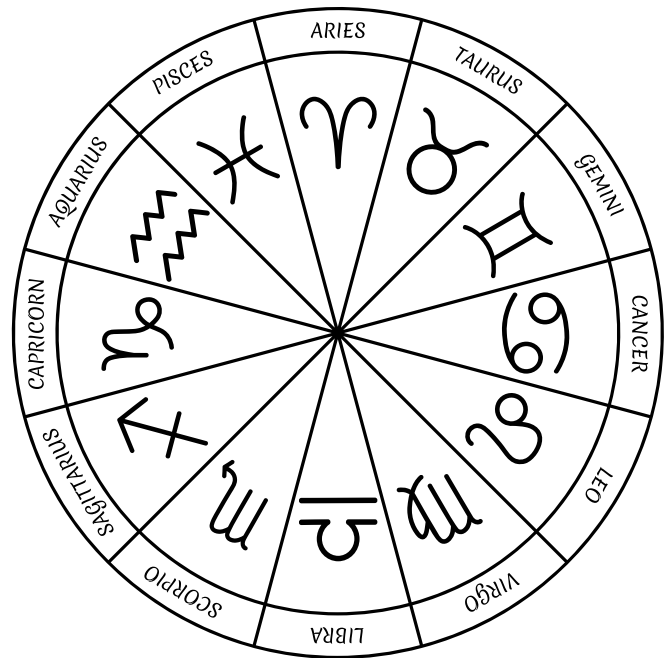

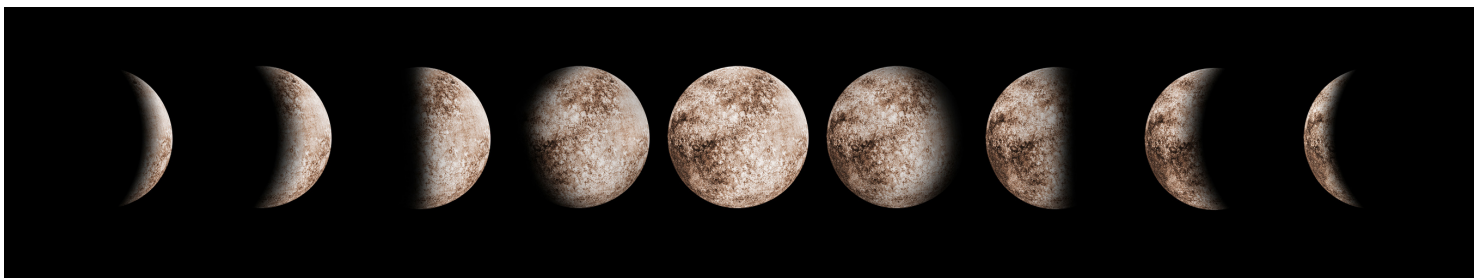

# Crystal of the Edition

## Turquoise

Many Indigenous tribes valued turquoise for ceremonial objects and amulets. The Apache believed an amulet of turquoise would improve its wearer's aim with a bow and arrow (or perhaps the turquoise was attached to either the bow or arrow; this is unclear).

Ancient Persians used turquoise extensively to decorate many objects, from the mundane to the holy and wore the stones around their wrists or necks to warn them of approaching danger by changing color. (Turquoise changes color in response to light and chemical reactions.)

Turquoise is a birthstone for December and a planetary stone for Aquarius, Taurus, and Sagittarius.

Gods/Goddesses: Buddha, the Great Spirit, Sopedu, Hathor, Estsanatleki;

Chakra: throat;

Planet: Neptune, Venus;

Tarot: Empress.

Or it may be that you are being clear in your communication but that the receiver is simply not hearing it either because they do not understand or because they are rejecting it. It is not always possible to get through to someone, but in this case, it can be done by changing how you are communicating, or you would not have drawn this card for the situation at question.*
