Letter from M. Rev. Don Lewis FP

Greetings everyone,

I would first like to thank everyone who has been praying and sending healing energy and good wishes to me. Thank you all so much. Please know that I greatly appreciate each of you and all your efforts.

During the twenty days I spent in the hospital I did a lot of work with the Ancestors, and they had many things of importance to say to me. Most important is that this near-death is the beginning of a new chapter in my life. This event happened just days after my forty-forth anniversary as First Priest of the Correllian Tradition. The Ancestors have told me that in these forty-four years I have fulfilled the promises that I made to them and have successfully completed my spiritual mission on their behalf. This does not mean of course that I will no longer be working with these things, but the principle goals have been successfully achieved.

Consequently, having taken counsel with the Ancestors, I feel that the time has come to follow First Priestess Krystel's example by Retiring in Office and allowing others to guide the way into the future. This does not mean I will not still be around. As a reminder, the First Priesthood is an office for life and cannot be resigned. But one can Retire in Office. Like Lady Krystel I will retain the rank and powers of my office but will retire from using them on an everyday basis in favor of a successor. Like Lady Krystel I will retain my position on the Council of Elders and will take on the role of an elder statesman, here to advise and assist but passing on the day-to-day duties of the office of First Priest.

As with Lady Krystel and the investiture of her successor Lady Stephanie, the situation differs from what would happen if I had actually died, in that I can simply name my successor and proceed. My successor will be known as First Priest Regent until their investiture, and First Priest thereafter, although I remain First Priest Retired in Office. My chosen successor has long been known to the First Elder Right Reverend Alyssa Maxon Kemp and First Priestess Most Reverend Stephanie Neal.


My chosen successor is His Grace the Right Reverend Ser Phoenix Coffin-Williams, Arch Priest and Lord of Holistic Knowledge, who with this proclamation becomes His Eminence the Most Reverend Phoenix Coffin-Williams, First Priest Regent. (By virtue of their role as Tradition Fons Honorum the First Priesthood do not use the style Ser even if otherwise entitled to it.)

With this act the entirety of the Correllian leadership is now composed of students trained through Witch School: Chancellor and First Priestess Most Reverend Stephanie Neal, First Priest Regent Most Reverend Phoenix Coffin-Williams, First Director Right Reverend Ser Jason Highcorrell, and First Elder Right Reverend Alyssa Maxon Kemp. This is a seismic shift and is part of why my mission to the Ancestors is completed, as part of it was creating a standardized training program which is now complete and eminently successful.

As First Priest Retired in Office I will continue to guide and advise as needed and will devote my Correllian efforts to spiritual pursuits including writing, teaching, and oracular work.

I have absolute confidence in Lady Stephanie and Lord Phoenix as First Priesthood, as I am sure you do as well. Lady Krystel and I, who now stand with one foot in the Court of the Ancestors, are proud to see them move forward and are proud of all of our fine Correllian people. Truly, it is all of you who have made this journey, with its many joys and sacrifices, worthwhile. I commend Lady Stephanie and Lord Phoenix, and all of you who form the Great Family.

March Festival Recipes

Ostara Recipe for the Northern Hemisphere

Potato Bake with Fresh Greens found at https://healthandfood.blog/

INGREDIENTS

- 2 potatoes (sliced)
- 1/4 cup sour cream
- 1/2 cup dry yeast
- 1/4 cup bean sprouts
- 2 cups leafy green vegetables (chopped into small pieces)
- 1 raw egg



INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.

Place sliced potatoes in a large baking dish and spread evenly over the bottom of the dish.

In a separate bowl, whisk together sour cream, dry yeast, bean sprouts, and chopped leafy green vegetables until well combined. Sprinkle with cheese.

Pour the mixture over the potatoes and bake uncovered for 30 minutes or until the top is golden brown.

Meanwhile, bring a pot of salted water to a boil and add the raw egg. Boil for 8 minutes before removing from heat and draining away any excess water. Allow the egg to cool before carefully peeling it off its shell, then cut it into slices.

Once the potato bake is finished baking, remove from oven and top with sliced boiled egg for garnish. Serve warm!

Mabon Recipe for the Southern Hemisphere

INGREDIENTS

- 2 tsp. olive oil
- 2 cups potatoes
- 4 oz. carrots
- 1/3 cup onion
- 1/4 tsp kosher salt
- 1/3 cup unsalted butter
- 1/3 cup flour
- 1 2/3 cups broth
- 2/3 cup milk
- 1/4 teaspoon celery salt
- ½ tsp. dried thyme
- ¼ cup frozen peas
- ¼ cup frozen green beans
- 1 pie crust or biscuits
- ½ c. milk



INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat the oven to 425F.

Dice potatoes. Dice carrots and onions.

Heat a large pan over medium heat. Add the oil. Saute potatoes until they are partially translucent.

Add carrots and onions and saute until soft. Do not allow them to brown.

Add butter and salt to the sauteed vegetables.

In a small bowl, stir broth and milk together.

Place flour into a large bowl. Whisk in ½ of the broth and milk until smooth. Add remaining broth and milk mixture.

Slowly add flour, broth, and milk mixture to the pan, stirring as you add it.

Once combined, add celery salt, thyme, peas, and green beans. Stir until combined.

Pour into an 8" pan or 8 x 8" casserole dish. Top with crust or biscuits.

If you've used crust, cut slits into the crust to vent it. Brush the tops of your crust of biscuits with milk.

Bake for 30 - 45 minutes, until the crust is golden brown.

Put the beads on the metal wire and wrap it around the handle of the spoon. Glue moss on with the egg on top. It's very simple.

March By Rev. Anna



The name of March comes from Martius, the first month of the earliest Roman calendar. It was named after Mars, the Roman god of war, and an ancestor of the Roman people through his sons Romulus and Remus. His month Martius was the beginning of the season for warfare and the festivals held in his honour during the month were mirrored by others in October, when the season for these activities came to a close. Martius remained the first month of the Roman calendar year perhaps as late as 153 BC and several religious observances in the first half of the month were originally new year's celebrations. Even in late antiquity, Roman mosaics picturing the months sometimes still placed March first.

March 1 began the numbered year in Russia until the end of the 15th century. Great Britain and its colonies continued to use March 25 until 1752, when they finally adopted the Gregorian calendar (the fiscal year in the UK continues to begin on 6 April, initially identical to 25 March in the former Julian calendar). Many other cultures, for example in Iran, or Ethiopia, still celebrate the beginning of the New Year in March.

March is the first month of spring in the Northern Hemisphere (North America, Europe, Asia and part of Africa) and the first month of fall or autumn in the Southern Hemisphere (South America, part of Africa, and Oceania).

Ancient Roman observances celebrated in March include Agonium Martiale, celebrated on March 1, March 14, and March 17, Matronalia, celebrated on March 1, Junonalia, celebrated on March 7, Equirria, celebrated on March 14, Mamuralia, celebrated on either March 14 or March 15, Hilaria on March 15 and then through March 22–28, Argei, celebrated on March 16–17, Liberalia and Bacchanalia, celebrated March 17, Quinquatria, celebrated March 19–23, and Tubilustrium, celebrated March 23. These dates do not correspond to the modern Gregorian calendar.

March Full Moon

Today, most western countries have a solar calendar widely known as the Gregorian calendar with 365 days divided into 12 months of 28 to 31 days each. Many eastern countries still follow a lunar calendar and their new year, as well as many other festivities do not always fall on the same day of the year but around a particular full or new moon of a given month. Cultures that traditionally followed a lunar calendar or even communities such as agricultural communities often named the 13 moons of each year much as we name the 12 months of our year. Month means moon which is the proof that the idea of months came from the moon originally. Before the modern calendars were put into use, most calendars followed 13 months which followed the 28-day cycles of the moon. With 13 months of 28 days, the year was 364 days instead of 365 which means, after several years, the calendar was off track. Today we have longer months and 365 days, so each month has one full moon making 12 full moons per year. However, every two and a half years a blue moon occurs meaning we have 13 moons in one calendar year. Hence the saying, "Once in a blue moon." This series of articles will talk about each moon, its significance, and the origin of its name for each month.

The March Full Moon is called the Worm Moon referring to the worms and larvae that start coming out of the thawed soil, tree bark and other hiding places for insects during winter. There is now enough sunlight to start thawing the frozen ground even if there is still snow cover on the ground. Birds are seen as they swoop down to feast on the worms and larvae announcing the spring time. Soon we will start seeing plants sprout and bloom. For some northern tribes the March full moon is called the Sugar Moon because the sap of maple trees thaws and flows once more.

In 2023 theWorm Moon will be visible March 6th and 7th and will reach it's peak around 7:42 EST on the 7th. This full moon will look very large when near the horizon. If you are lucky to have a light rain, you might get to see a moonbow which is a rainbow created with moonlight instead of sunlight. This phenomenon only happens when the moon is low in the sky so slightly after sunset.

The full moon of March announces the Ostara season or the Spring Equinox. This is the last full moon before Ostara to charge your crystals, candles, herbs, spells, water, or anything you might need for ritual so don't miss it!

The Festival of Hilaria March 25 By Rev. Anna



In the last several centuries before the fall of the Roman Empire (476 A.D.), Roman devotees of the goddess Cybele celebrated a festival of laughter and rejoicing on this day, March 25. Known as Hilaria, it was considered the day of the resurrection of the god Attis, who had died three days earlier.

As the god of vegetation and beloved son and lover of the goddess Cybele, he represented the god-sacrifice who, after dying, rises again (by the hand of the Goddess) as the spirit of spring.

Scholars believe that worship of Cybele began in an ancient kingdom known as Phrygia, located in what is now west-central Turkey, that flourished between the twelfth and seventh centuries B.C.

The great mother goddess Cybele dominated Phrygian religious life. When the Romans began to worship Cybele, she was recognized as the great mother goddess, the mother of gods, beasts, and human beings. Many also viewed her as the mother of the natural world.

One of the most important myths concerning Cybele told of her great fondness for a youth called Attis, her son and devotee. Countless versions of the tale circulated throughout the ancient world, and many of them revolve around the revenge taken by the goddess when the young man's attention turns briefly to a human woman. In one version of the tale, Attis' single-minded devotion to the goddess wavered long enough for him to become engaged to a princess. Enraged, Cybele caused him to go mad, and in his madness he castrated himself and died. Flowers sprang from his blood and his body turned into a pine tree.

In other versions of the story Attis is killed by a spear thrust, or by a wild boar, and in yet another version Cybele, remorseful over Attis' bloody death, succeeds in preserving him from decay by keeping him in a sort of semi-living state. In other telling's of the myth, Attis is seen as a deity rather than a human being, and in still others Attis achieves immortality after his death.



<u>Witan Shrines</u> are the first level of the Temple-Making Process. Witan Shrines are created by Charter of the Tradition and may progress to Full Temple status over the course of several years or remain at Witan Shrine status indefinitely.

<u>Proto-Temples</u> are groups which have progressed beyond the status of Shrines and are on their way to becoming Full Temples but have not yet achieved that status.

<u>Full Temples</u> of the Correllian Tradition have completed the Temple-Making Process and, if headed by a Third Degree, have representation on the Witan Council. A Full Temple can perform all of the functions of a Temple and may in some cases have multiple branches.


